Welcome.

This Advent season at Park Church, we're letting the Advent and Christmas hymns of old lead us.

WHY HYMNS?

Although these centuries-old hymns may be familiar for some of us, the truths they present will be no less astonishing to a listening heart. Using language and poetry that has transcended generations, Advent and Christmas hymns are excellent marriages of Scripture, storytelling, and felt longing unmediated by the cheap sentimentality so often associated with this season.

USING THIS GUIDE

We'll use a simple weekly and daily rhythm over the next four weeks of Advent, taking us to Christmas Eve:

Weekly Rhythm

Each week will start with a hymn to sing on Sunday. You can sing as a household or on your own, at a mealtime or in the morning, with backing music or a cappella. However you choose to sing, make space to be present with the lyrics.

After singing the hymn for the week on Sunday, the next five days will each include a 5–10 minute devotional based on a stanza or section of the hymn for individual, group, or family reflection.

Daily Rhythm

Each day includes the following:

- 1. A stanza or section from the week's hymn
- 2. A short passage of Scripture
- 3. A reflection question or two

You can choose how you want to use these daily elements. There is a little space to write on each day's page, but for some, using a journal on the side will be helpful for more processing space. For others, it may be better not to write at all—simply listen and pray or discuss with others. Families may consider listening to the hymn throughout the week and/or discussing the reflection questions together at a meal time. Most reflections are applicable to all ages, but some days also include specific questions for children.

There is no content on Saturdays—choose your own adventure! You can spend your time in silence and solitude, praying through a different beloved song, catching up on weekday readings that you missed, going deeper with certain passages from the week's readings, or something else entirely.

However you engage with this devotional guide, our hope is that Jesus meets you in those places, bringing weariness to rejoicing.

Reflection Questions:

What is it like to wait for something exciting? Consider Simeon waiting to see his Savior in the flesh. He had hope. What would his joy be like when holding that baby? What does your hope feel like when you consider being with Jesus in person?

WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 1 COME, THOU LONG EXPECTED JESUS

Today's Lyrics:

Though we hear the whisper faintly, "Lo, I'm making all things new" Every tribe and tongue and race Will shout "His word has all been true!"

Today's Scripture Passage:

"And He who was seated on the throne said, 'Behold, I am making all things new.' Also He said, 'Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true."" (Revelation 21:5)

Reflection Questions:

How does it feel to consider that this promise from Jesus, "I am making all things new," is an unchangeable truth toward which our world is moving?

Kids, Jesus promises to make all things new. Describe what it is like to get something new.

THURSDAY, DECEMBER 2 COME, THOU LONG EXPECTED JESUS

Today's Lyrics:

Born to reign in us forever Now Thy gracious kingdom bring

Today's Scripture Passage:

"But the people refused to obey the voice of Samuel. And they said, 'No! But there shall be a king over us, that we also may be like all the nations, and that our king may judge us and go out before us and fight our battles." (I Samuel 8:19–20)

Reflection Questions:

As Israel set their hope on a human king, rejecting God as their king, so our hearts are quick to find a standin "king" to validate us and fight for us. How does the impotence and betrayal of these rulers make you feel about the hope of a good king?

Kids, think about a good King. What is he like, what would he do, and how would he lead his people? Jesus is the good, perfect, King we long for.

FRIDAY, DECEMBER 3 COME, THOU LONG EXPECTED JESUS

Today's Lyrics:

By Thine all-sufficient merit Raise us to Thy glorious throne

Today's Scripture Passage:

"For not by their own sword did they win the land, nor did their own arm save them, but Your right hand and Your arm, and the light of your face, for you delighted in them." (Psalm 44:3)

Reflection Questions:

Close your eyes and use your imagination to consider how glorious and holy the throne and ruling place of Jesus must be. What does it sound like there? How do you feel? What is it like knowing that, because of Jesus' work, this place is not only welcoming to you, but a home?





SUNDAY, DECEMBER 5

MONDAY, DECEMBER 6 O COME O COME EMMANUEL

Today's Lyrics:

O come, O come, Emmanuel And ransom captive Israel That mourns in lonely exile here Until the Son of God appear

Today's Scripture Passage:

"'She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.' All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet:

'Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call His name Immanuel'

(which means, God with us)."" (Matthew 1:21-23)

Reflection Questions:

For a variety of reasons, holidays can be one of the loneliest seasons of the year. Where is your heart lonely right now? What are you mourning? What might it look like to invite Emmanuel, God With Us, into those places of felt "captivity" and "exile?"

Kids, what makes you feel sad or alone? Jesus is the one who brings us peace. When we feel like God is far from us, we can ask Him to come close.

TUESDAY, DECEMBER 7 O COME O COME EMMANUEL

Today's Lyrics:

O come Thou Day-Spring, come and cheer Our spirits by Thine advent here And drive away the shades of night And pierce the clouds & bring us light

Today's Scripture Passage:

"...because of the tender mercy of our God,
whereby the sunrise shall visit us from on high
to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death,
to guide our feet into the way of peace."
(Luke 1:78-79)

Reflection Question:

"Day-spring" is another word for dawn or morning. As we wait for the coming of the dawn in Christ, we recognize the reality that we often sit in darkness. How might the reality of God's coming dawn cheer your heart in the midst of these current clouds and shadows?

Kids, think about what it's like when a light comes on in a dark room. Turn off the lights and sit in the dark for a moment. Then, light a candle or turn on a lamp. What happened? Remember that Jesus is the light of the world!

WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 8 O COME O COME EMMANUEL

Today's Lyrics:

Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel Shall come to thee, O Israel

Today's Scripture Passage:

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:4-7)

Reflection Questions:

When was the last time you experienced something that really opened the doors of your heart to delight, peace, or rest? What was that? This song calls us back to the reality that Jesus' first and future coming are a source of great delight. How can you rejoice in faith today, knowing Jesus has come and will return again? Rejoice, celebrate, jump for joy! Jesus is coming! Move your body to celebrate!

THURSDAY, DECEMBER 9 O COME O COME EMMANUEL

Today's Lyrics:

O come, Desire of nations, bind In one the hearts of all mankind Bid Thou our sad divisions cease And be Thyself our King of Peace

Today's Scripture Passage:

"For He Himself is our peace, who has made us both one and has broken down in His flesh the dividing wall of hostility by abolishing the law of commandments expressed in ordinances, that He might create in Himself one new man in place of the two, so making peace, and might reconcile us both to God in one body through the cross, thereby killing the hostility."

(Ephesians 2:14-16)

Reflection Questions:

In our country and even in the Church, it's hard to picture a time when we were more divided than we are now. We need a Divine binding; we need the King of Peace to bid our innumerable divisions cease. Where have you personally experienced some of those divisions? Ask the Lord to make these divisions cease.

Kids, what is it like to disagree with someone? How does it feel? Jesus is our King of Peace. Ask him to give you peace when you disagree with someone.

FRIDAY, DECEMBER 10 O COME O COME EMMANUEL

Today's Lyrics:

Today's Scripture Passages:

"There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit. And the Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon Him..." (Isaiah 11:1-2a)

"...how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him."

(Acts 10:38)

Reflection Questions:

Our world is broken and sinful. These are the effects of Satan. Where do you see brokenness in your life or the world around you? This is why we need Jesus and the whole world needs Jesus. Ask God to restore the brokenness in your own life and in the world around you.

Reflection Questions:

Take a moment to enter into the joy that the good news of Jesus brings. How can I "repeat the joy" to someone else today? Who in my life needs some encouragement today?

Kids, play a game of "Repeat After Me." What are some truths about Jesus? Take turns sharing a Jesus truth and having everyone repeat it. Here are some ideas: Jesus is King! Jesus is Alive! Jesus saved me! Jesus loves me!

WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 15 JOY TO THE WORLD

Today's Scripture Passage:

Reflection Questions:

Briefly consider the outrageously vivid, utterly mysterious planet God made for us to inhabit. Now reflect on a simple creature comfort you happen to enjoy. Across this spectrum, what are a couple gifts from God that you can celebrate with Him?

Kids, God is so beautiful and He gives us good, beautiful gifts. Every good and perfect gift comes from God. Can you thank God for those gifts and the joy they bring you?

THURSDAY, DECEMBER 16 JOY TO THE WORLD

Today's Lyrics:

Today's Scripture Passage:

Reflection:

Spend a moment imagining what life will be like without sin, disease, pain, and death. Write down or share what you imagine. Thank Jesus that this day will one day come, and ask Him for more joy in hoping for that day to come.

Reflection Question

This Christmas Eve as you consider His first coming, what does Jesus' power and glory stir up in your heart?
